# CULTURALLY RESPONSIVE WRITING INSTRUCTION

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#### Culturally Responsive Teaching (review)

- Validating: Teaching to and through the strengths of students.
- Comprehensive: Teaching the whole child.
- Multidimensional: Teaching in a variety of modalities.
- Empowering: Enabling students to be more successful learners.
- Transformative: Helping students to develop as social critics for reflective decision making.
- Emancipatory: Liberating, not solely prescribed to mainstream ways of knowing.

#### Process...

- Class Creates an ABC Taxonomy of Dance Words
- Class Watches a Wide Range of Dance Videos on Youtube
- Students Record what They See
- Students can Dance While Watching and Writing
- Class Categorizes Dances with a Tree Map
- Students Write a Formal Essay about One of the Dances
